On the October 28, 2017 PATNZ held our annual Unit Standard exams for Porcelain Painters around New Zealand to submit pieces for assessment. We had three categories this year: Unit 13L Lustres, Unit 15 Monochromatic and Unit 16 Bone.

As with every year it's a bit like having lots of parcels to open and the excitement of what is there makes the whole experience wonderful. I am always amazed at the efforts and ideas that come from everyone.



Μv Husband Jeff does the unpacking and labeling so I do not get to see any pieces until the day of judging. I feel that this is important for me as when the judges arrive we are all on the same footing. All the judges are given information as to

what units pieces are being submitted so they can review the Unit Guidelines and be informed of what is required to pass the exam.

We are very happy to congratulate Glenys Muntz for not only passing three Unit Standards this time but also that she has completed all 17 Units and has achieved her

and you now have a very good and knowledgeable understanding of the lovely art of painting porcelain.

Also Christine Handley passed Unit 16 Bone. Certificates have been printed and are being posted to the recipients this week.

As with a lot of exams not everyone gets a pass, but I know with encouragement and some extra information that I will be sending out to them will help with mastering these and other Units in the future.

### Painting with Monica!



Well ladies it's getting to that time of the year when Christmas takes over and painting porcelain can often go on the back burner. A perfect time to think about giving your equipment and brushes a good clean. Brushes especially need particular care.

Here are a few tips I have found worthwhile:

• Clean your brushes thoroughly with turps, blot dry, place a little of your open medium onto the brush, blot again, and store covered to keep them dust free.

• Use a paint brush holder or a good plastic container with dividers to keep brushes in good condition.

• When cleaning gold and platinum brushes a little rose oil helps them to stay soft and not become brittle.

After the holidays and you are ready to start painting you will reap the benefit of good brush care.

Experiment before starting that master piece!!
